3. Profile of skills and competences

The Skilled Building Supervisor is a profession established in 2012. It builds and expands on the traditional working areas of Janitor. The Building Supervisor ensures the smooth running of the building and its installations. The Building Supervisor also sees to repairs and maintenance, therefore it is important that the Building Supervisor has an understanding of the building as a whole and the functioning of its technical installations. The Building Supervisor needs to have competence across traditional vocational boundaries and be able to assess the need for external competence and request it when needed. The Building Superviser works towards an environmentally healthy building environment, including energy optimalisation. The training within the vocation should ensure the health and the security of others in all types of activity that are carried out within the building. The training for this vocation consists of one year in school and 3 years training in working life.

Additional information

The first two years of the training take place in a school. This comprises a total of 588 hours in Common core subjects, 954 hours in Common programme subjects, 421 hours vocational specialization. This is followed by two years of training in a company, where one year is training and one year is productive work. Adult students may in some cases be exempted from the requirement for the common core subjects.
